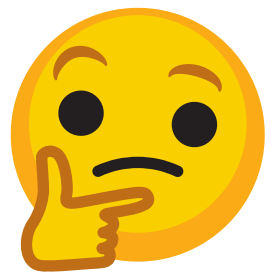


Idolatry is like an old Bible problem right?!?!?

Ask yourself honestly...



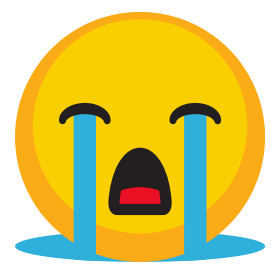
- When do you feel most disappointed?
